

Press Release: New Recycling Murals For Hailsham East

New mural displays at the Town Farm estate recycling site have been installed as part of this year's Hailsham In Bloom campaign, replacing the existing weather-damaged murals produced almost three years ago.

Working under the supervision of the Town Farm Residents' Association, young people from the recently launched Young Farmers' Youth Club contributed to the design and painting of the recycling inspired graffiti designs onto the mural boards located next to the Hailsham East Community Centre.

A Hailsham In Bloom spokesperson said, "Local recycling centres are more widely used nowadays and having eye-catching mural artwork displayed at each site is a great way of reminding everyone to make 'reduce, reuse and recycle', and make full use of all the waste recycling facilities."
